



CHAPTER ONE

THE INVESTMENT PROGRAMME FOR CIVIL MINISTRIES

1-1: Preamble:

The investment programme of the Plan represents the driving executive tool by which its objectives, policies, dimensions and mechanisms needed to be achieved during the development process are accomplished. For this, the basic dimensions of the financial framework of the Eighth Five-Year Development Plan, together with the principles and priorities approved for formulation of the investment programme are reviewed. Further, the executive steps for approving new projects in the Eighth Development Plan for civil ministries, and their sectoral, regional and annual distribution are also reviewed.

The formulation of the investment programme of the Plan was distinguished by active participation of majlis A'shura. The major features of the Plan were submitted to the Honorable Majlis in December 2010. The Majlis expressed valuable views that were taken in consideration when approving the investment programme.

1-2: Basic dimensions of the financial framework of the Eighth Five-Year Development Plan:

The investment programme was formulated pursuant to the basic dimensions of the financial framework of the Plan per Royal Decree No. (1/2011) issued in 1/1/2011manifested in the following:

- 1- Promoting opportunities of continuous growth and pursue to realize low inflation rates through coordination between monetary and fiscal polices.
- 2- Expansion in provision of new work opportunities for the national workforce.
- 3- Achieving full enrolment rates in general education, increasing intake capacity of higher education and upgrading quality of education.
- 4- Observance to social aspects, regional and environmental dimensions of development
- 5- Promoting chances of sustainable tourism development, implementation of the industrial strategy and development of the agriculture and fisheries sectors.
- 6- Increasing oil and gas production rates, expansion in exploration processes and managing deficit in energy supply according to the best alternatives.
- 7- Stimulating the domestic private sector and attraction of foreign investment beside the development of SMEs.
- 8- Implementation of strategies of Oman digital society and scientific research.
- 9- Development and raising efficiency of the State's Administrative Apparatus, directing media activity to serve the development pace and upgrading statistical work.

1-3: : Approved priorities and principles for formulation of the investment programme of civil ministries in the Eighth Five-Year Development Plan:

When formulating and preparing the investment programme of civil ministries for the Eighth Plan, and to maximize the returns of the investment programme to achieve its aims, a set of priorities and principles that should be followed by ministries as guidelines when preparing their investment plans and programmes were adopted. These included:

A: Priorities of new projects:

- 1- Projects issued by Royal Orders.
- 2- Projects aiming at maintenance of existing government assets.
- 3- Projects that create new work opportunities for citizens.
- 4- Projects that support the economic diversification policies.
- 5- Projects that accede to the basic needs of citizens in education, health, housing, water and sanitary drainage.

B: Principles to be followed for formulation of the Plan's investment programme:

Taking in consideration priorities of the new projects in the Eighth Plan, the approved principles for formulation of the Plan's investment programme were as follows:

- 1- Ministries should review the status of projects approved in previous plans which their implementation already commenced. The size of the expected free balances should be determined from their records. Ministries should define the projects of importance to be implemented during the coming Plan using the aforementioned balances.
- 2- Each ministry or government unit should link the proposed projects with the objectives and policies stated in the sectroal plans as per the e-form for this purpose.
- 3- Civil ministries should arrange their projects according to their priorities and in conformity with priorities mentioned above with observance of accuracy in determining the estimated costs of their projects.
- 4- Defining the operating costs that arise due to execution of new development projects during the Plan years.
- 5- Continuance of policy of not creating new building projects except at minimum level.
- 6- Priority during the first years of the Plan should be given to on-going projects from the Seventh Plan as far as possible.
- 7- Awarding more observance to the regional dimension of development in order to reduce the

discrepancy among regions and income categories through geographic distribution of investment. Emphasis to be directed to regions that have not received ample share of investments during previous Five-Year Plans.

- 8- Gradual implementation of projects during the Plan period to avoid bottlenecks at sectoral and national economy levels.
- 9- Closure of on-going projects from the Fifth and Sixth Five-Year Plans (2005 projects and below). Such projects should not be included in the Eighth Plan if possible.

The above said priorities and principles were included in circular No. (1/2010) pertaining to the formulation of the investment programme of the Eighth Plan issued in 23/1/2010. Ministries were requested to submit their proposals for the Plan's development programme for the Eighth Plan not later than the end of April 2010. This will enable the Ministry of National Economy to study the proposals of the development programme submitted by the ministries and the various government units and identify the new projects in the Eighth Plan. The memorandum of the development programme shall then be submitted to the Supreme Committee for Formulation of the Five-Year Development Plans, the Honorable Cabinet, Majlis A'Shura and thereafter for approval by His Majesty the Sultan.

1-4: Measures taken for formulation of the investment plan for civil ministries:

Within the context of previously stated priorities and principles that were approved by the Supreme Committee for Formulation of the Plan, the Ministry of National Economy undertook the following procedures:

- 1- The Plan formulation circular No. (1/2010) was sent to all ministries and government units on 23/1/2010 comprising principles and priorities to be followed for formulation of the investment programme for the Eighth Plan.
- 2- The e-form for the new development projects was sent to the various ministries and government units to be automatically filled in for each proposed investment project to be included in the investment Plan through the e-system for the new projects on the website of Ministry of National Economy.
- 3- The Ministry of National Economy presented the e-system to those concerned at ministries and government units and received their comments. The Ministry, afterwards, trained the concerned at these units on the use of the system and mechanism of entering the new projects and sending them to Ministry of National Economy.
- 4- The proposals of new investment projects for the Plan were received totaling about R.O (18.7) billion. This largely exceeds the available approbations of the Plan's public expenditure according to initial estimates which shall lead to imbalance in distribution of the public expenditure allocations among its various items. Therefore, the Ministry of National Economy selected a set of new development projects to be implemented during the Eighth Plan according to the criteria mentioned below.

1-5 : Cost of total approbations of investment programme in the Eighth Five-Year Development Plan for civil ministries :

A- Approbations for cost of on-going projects transferred from the Seventh Five-Year Development Plan:

In view of the actual expenditure on the projects of the Seventh Plan (initial closure of the Seventh Plan), the cost of on-going projects transferred from the Seventh Plan to the Eighth Plan reached about R.O (6484.8) million from civil ministries investments.

B- Approbations for the cost of new projects:

Due to the very high size of amounts presented by government units for new projects which reached R.O (18.7) billion, the Ministry of National Economy exerted a large effort to review and study these projects and reach a reasonable size that conform with both basic dimensions of the Eighth Plan and new projects priorities as stated in the circular for formulation of the Plan (particularly, that amount of R.O (2) billion were allocated for new projects in the circular). The projects were categorized into three groups as follows:

- Strategic projects proposed to be approved
- Other projects proposed to be approved
- Unapproved projects

In light of the aforementioned approved priorities, principles and considerations, and the discussions and observations of both the Supreme Committee of the Eighth Plan and the Honorable Council of Ministers, and taking in considerations the views of Honorable Majlis A'Shura and the thorough discussions with the various ministries and government units and their responses to their development programme, the cost of new projects in the Eighth Plan (the investment programme for civil ministries) was approved at R.O (5571.6) million as indicated in Table No.(1) below.

Accordingly, total approbations allocated for civil ministries' investments within the development budget in the Eighth Plan approved on 1/1/2010 for on-going and new projects totaled R.O (12056.4) million. Table No. (2) below indicates total approbations allocated for civil ministries investments within the development budget of the Eighth Plan compared with the approbations of the Seventh Plan on 1/1/2006. The Table indicates that the total approbations of the Eighth Plan for civil ministries investments which totaled R.O (12056.4) million exceeded by (299.7%) the planned approbations of the Seventh Plan which were R.O (3016.3) million. This was due to the large volume of the on-going approbations transferred from the Seventh Plan as result of the large additions on the said Plan.

1-6: Sectoral distribution of cost of civil ministries' investments:

Based on the aforementioned principles and considerations undertaken when formulating the civil ministries investment programme, and according to the views and proposals of the various ministries and government units pertaining to the distribution of their new projects contracts, the final sectoral distribution is indicated in Table No.(4) and Figure No.(1) below for cost of new and on-going projects in the Eighth Plan.


It is evident from the Table, according to the sectoral distribution of new projects, that the infrastructure sector acquires most of the civil ministries investments for new projects accounting to about (60.9%), followed by social structures projects (18.7%), service production projects (17.3%) and finally commodity production projects (3.1%). Comparing with the Figure for the new projects in the Seventh Plan, it could be noticed that the sequence of this acquisition is the same during the Eighth Plan in terms of relative share. The infrastructure sector acquired most of the civil ministries investments in new projects accounting for (50.2%) followed by social structures projects (26.5%), service production projects (20.3%) and finally commodity production projects (3%).

1-7: Regional distribution of cost of civil ministries' investments:

Based on the direction of the Eighth Plan to reduce discrepancy among regions and the geographic distribution of investments with emphasis on regions that had not received substantial share of development in previous plans aiming for their development, and to extend the outcomes of development to all areas of the Sultanate, the cost of investments of the Eighth Plan was distributed among various regions as indicated in Table No. (8) and Figure No (2), and by main sectors as in Table No.(9) below. It is evident from Table No.(8), by excluding the national projects, that the relative share for all regions outside Muscat Governorate for new projects amounted to R.O (69.1%) compared with (73.3%) in the Seventh Plan. It is worth mentioning that the national projects included approbations that shall be later on distributed among the various regions during the Eighth Plan period.


